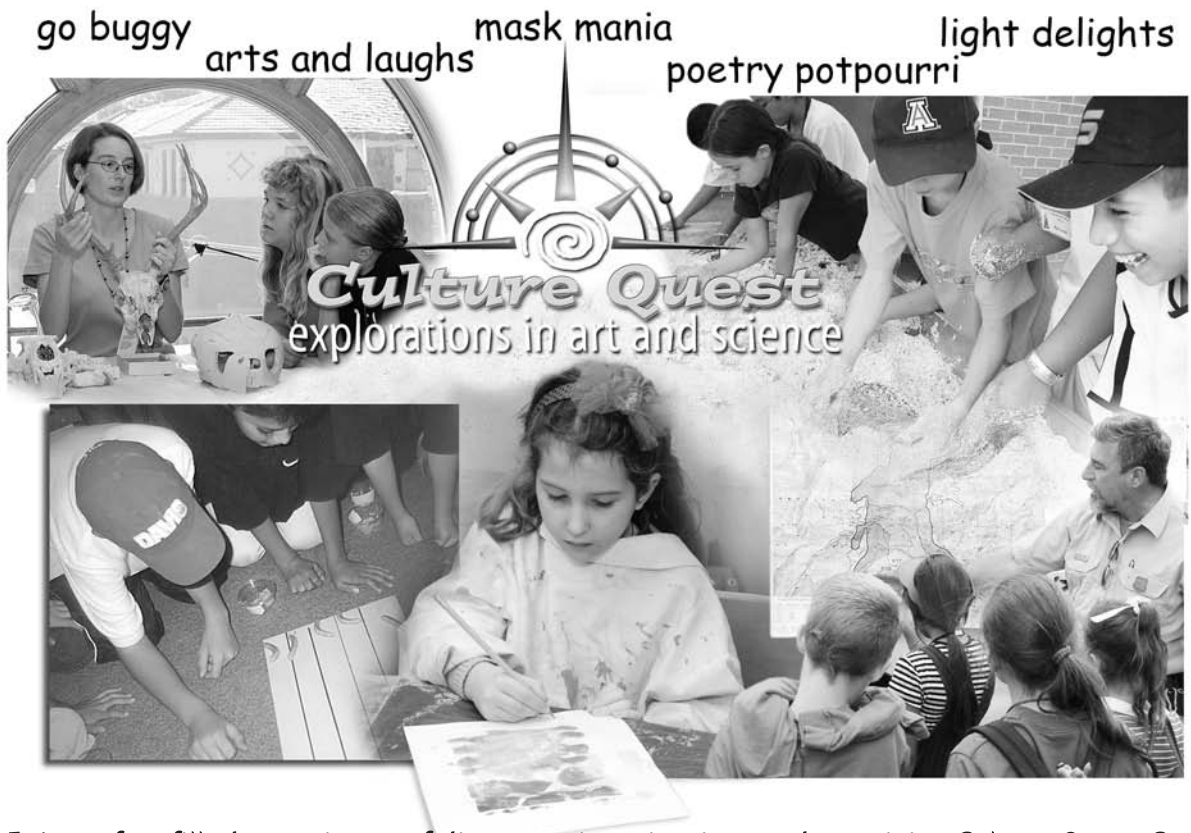


# SUMMER CAMP!
